

2018 NEXT STEP—EARLY SCHOOL LEAVERS SURVEY

The Queensland Government is conducting its annual statewide survey of Year 10, 11 and 12 students who left school in 2017 without obtaining a Year 12 certification. The Early School Leavers survey is a short, confidential survey that collects information about what young people are doing the year after leaving school.

Between August and September, students who left school early in 2017, can expect to receive an invitation to complete a web-based survey or a telephone call from the Queensland Government Statistician's Office to complete the survey.
